Indians belonginge to Natick & Punkapaugo

Right Honourable. Whereas it hath pleased God in these late  
warres and troubles by his providence so to order it that severall  
of our kindred (beinge also Related too and scattered amongst  
those that were our enemies and some of them that were found  
amongst our enemies) were justly taken and Captivated: and  
these few lines are earnestly to intreat your honours in the  
behalf of one of our negro kindred called Peter an Indian  
youth who submitted himselfe to the English the last August  
in plimouth patten and was from thence sold in to this Colony  
and ever he continued faithfully servinge his master John  
Kingley of Milton: till by order of the Honored Council  
he with others were ordered to be brought before them at  
which time the sd Peter was Comitted to prison and so  
continuinge we therefore whose names are underwritten do  
humbly crave of your Honored that the sd Peter the  
youth aforesd beinge nearly Related to us may have liberty  
granted to continue in this Contry that he may have liberty  
may have liberty to Redeeme him or that he may stay  
with his master: thus earnestly prayinge for your Honored  
prosperity and good success we Remaine your Honored most  
Humble petitioners and servants to our power.
